### **10th International workshop on “Empirical Methods in Energy Economics”**

**Los Angeles, USA, June 22-23, 2017**

The 10<sup>th</sup> International Workshop on Empirical Methods in Energy Economics will be held in Los Angeles, USA, on 22-23 June 2017. This workshop follows the tradition of successful predecessors held in Zurich, Switzerland (2008), Jasper, Canada (2009), Guilford, England (2010), Dallas, Texas (2011), Berlin, Germany (2012), Ottawa, Canada (2013), Aachen, Germany (2014), College Park, Maryland (2015), Oviedo, Spain (2016) and is intended to provide a forum for the development and application of empirical methods in energy economics. To provide a conducive environment for a comprehensive exchange of ideas concerning new empirical research in energy economics, the 2017 workshop is designed to allow time for a full presentation and discussion of each contribution. All sessions are plenary (no concurrent presentations) to ensure the workshop participants' attendance at all presentations.

All papers will be circulated in advance of the workshop so that participants have an opportunity to read them prior to the presentations. Participants are expected to attend the entire workshop and it is hoped that all participants will play a role as authors, discussants or session chairs. Doctoral students and young researchers are particularly encouraged to submit their papers. We especially welcome submissions based on novel econometric techniques, original and extensive datasets, rigorous study designs and having important policy implications.

The papers and posters for the 2017 workshop will be selected on the basis of extended abstracts (3-4 pages) structured as follows: 1) overview, 2) methods, 3) data and 4) preliminary results.

The deadline for submitting the extended abstracts (in PDF format) is March 31st, 2017. The abstracts will be reviewed by the Scientific Committee (see below), with acceptance decisions notified by April 15th, 2017. The extended abstract should be attached as PDF file to email sent to the local organizer at [abento@usc.edu](mailto:abento@usc.edu). Please write “EMEE paper

submission” in the subject space. Registration will be possible from mid April 2017, with the registration fee expected to be in the region of about \$150. Further information about the registration will follow in early 2017. Final papers, which will be available from the conference website, need to be submitted by June 15<sup>th</sup>, 2017.
